Description: Lighthouse Supported Living is an eight storey building added to the existing

Capri Hotel. The existing amenity areas of the Capri Hotel were renovated into personal services. The eight storey building contains apartment suites. The footprint of the building staggers to allow for windows along the property line

and to reduce snow drifting onto neighbouring properties.

Completion: 2012 - under construction

Value: \$13,000,000

Structural System: The structural system consists of reinforced cast-in-place concrete slabs

spanning between concrete beams and columns. Both in-slab heating lines and electrical conduit were cast in the slabs to minimize surface mounted conduit. Lateral stability of the building was developed through the use of reinforced concrete elevator and stairwell cores. The Mechanical Room penthouse is

constructed of structural steel.
